

Take a basic Side profile self portrait and print it onto A5.

Trace it onto black card and cut out the silhouette.

Use your silhouette to create a Double Exposure effect Photogram by applying objects into the space created by your cut-out silhouette.

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<u>CLICHE</u> Verre	Apply printing ink to a printing plate and scrape away to create different marks. Try tracing one of your own photographs. Expose your plate of ink over photographic paper in the darkroom and develop.	Take photos of the process and add to your website/sketchbook, with notes.
